

Triangle Baby Quilt

This is a really quick and easy quilt to make and would make a superb gift for a new baby. I have used fabrics from the Linea Collection by Makower UK. They read as solids but have a lovely crosshatch tonal design, which adds depth and interest to the quilt. The teal and yellow combined with the neutral colours makes it equally suitable for either a baby girl or boy.

Quilt Size:

107 x 122cm (42" x 48")

You Will Need:

0.5 metre (1/2 yard) each of 5 different fabrics. I have used Linea Teal, Linea Yellow, Linea Charcoal, Linea Grey and Linea Cream

122 x 137cm (48" x 54") wadding (batting)

2.5 metres (2 3/4 yds) backing fabric Note: I used Architextures extra wide backing and was able to get both the backing and the binding from 1 metre

(0.4 metre) 3/8 yd binding fabric

Instructions:

Print the template. Ensure the scaling on your printer is set to 100% or None and measure the 1" square to check that your templates are the right size.

Carefully cut out the templates.

Cut two 8.5" x width of fabric strips from each of your five fabrics.

Use the templates to cut the following:

From Cream cut: 18 A triangles + 2 C triangles

From Grey cut: 15 A triangles + 3 C triangles

From Teal cut: 15 A triangles + 1 C triangle + 1 B triangle

From Yellow cut: 15 A triangles + 3 B triangles

From Charcoal cut: 15 A triangles + 2 B triangles

The next step is completely optional, but I found it helped enormously with the accuracy of my piecing.

Use a needle to pierce a hole large enough to get a marking pen through at the intersection of the seam lines on the templates. Place the template on the back of each fabric triangle and mark the three seam intersection points through the holes in the template on the back of each triangle with an erasable marker such as a Frixion pen.

Refer to the layout diagram to lay the pieces out for each row.

Join the triangles in the first row, pinning together at the marked dots. Finger press the seams to the right.


Repeat for the second row, but finger press the seams to the left.

Repeat for the remaining rows, alternating the pressing on each row.

Join the rows together, matching the marked dots carefully as you go.


Complete your quilt in the usual manner.

Layout Diagram








Template A
